**Keynote Address: “Point of Care Sources for EBM (Internet and Handheld)”  
Stephan Oosterman, D.O.**

Dr. Stephan Oosterman is Medical Director of Shands Family Medicine Center and an Associate Professor in the Department of Community Health and Family Medicine at the University of Florida. His areas of research interest include medical informatics. He received his Bachelors degree in Biology and Chemistry from Calvin College in Grand Rapids, Michigan and his Doctorate from Michigan State University. After completing a residency in Family Medicine at Naval Hospital Jacksonville, Jacksonville Florida, he went on as a Faculty member there, eventually serving as the Director of Residency Training. After retiring from the Navy in 2001, Dr. Oosterman joined the Family Medicine Residency at the University of Florida’s Jacksonville campus. He, along with other faculty, recently completed a study in use of handheld medical decision support tools at point of care. He was also invited to participate in a national multidisciplinary work group looking at point of care and Continuing Medical Education.
