MASTERING CHANGE", which
included papers on library
services to multi-user groups,
the hospital library as a
corporate information center,
cost benefits of consortium
group purchasing, balancing
interlibrary loans within a
hospital library consortium, and
interactive videodisc in a
hospital setting.

The Hospital Library Section
business meeting/breakfast
featured a joint presentation by
Nina Mattheson, Director of
Welch Medical Library, Johns
Hopkins University and Irene
Lathrop, Director of the
Hospital Library at Rhode Island
Hospital. Their topic "A
National Agenda for Hospital
Library Information Services"
addressed implementation of
integrated library systems in
hospital libraries. There will
be an HLS Task Force addressing
this topic and volunteers who
are HLS members are needed.
