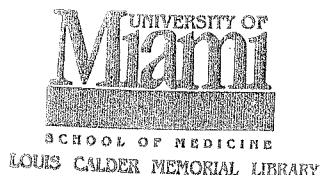

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE FLORIDA HEALTH SCIENCES LIBRARY ASSOCIATION ANNUAL MEETING

The 28th Annual Meeting of the Florida Health Sciences Library Association was held at the Brazilian Court Hotel, in Palm Beach, FL on April 27, 1990.

The Program Committee set as its goal to make the Annual Meeting interesting, informative and fun while keeping the cost as low as possible. Because the vendors were very generous in supporting the meeting by making donations and gifts in the amount of \$4,250.00, the education programs were offered to the membership at a cost of \$50.00 each and registration fees were reduced. There were sixteen persons enrolled in CE 129: Hospital Library Management and thirty-six persons enrolled in CD ROM: Technology and Applications.

Ten scholarships in the amount of \$135.00 were available for attending the FHSLA meeting this year. One-third of the money set aside for this purpose was used.

Major points discussed include advertisement of scholarships. Cheryl Dee recommended that in addition to the ALERT and word of mouth, a letter could be sent to persons on Sue Felber's hospital library list, and information placed in nursing service newsletters. Henry Lemkau stated the scholarships were not an ongoing project but dependent on money available in the General Operating Fund. The decision whether or not to offer scholarships would be determined by the Executive Committee annually.

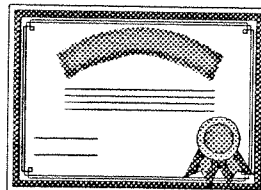
It was decided that scholarships will be made available to members of FHSLA only. Scholarships for our educational programs will also be offered to students of Library Services, but the amount and the criteria of selection will be determined by the Executive Committee.

Naomi Elia would like to step down from the chair of the Strategic Planning Committee, but has agreed to stay an additional year to revitalize the committee and to provide continuity. New committee members are needed. Two hospital librarians from each of the regions of the state (North, South, etc), one academic librarian from the western and southern regions, and one librarian from the category of "other health science libraries".

The Strategic Planning Committee meets at the Annual meeting and at a mid-year meeting. The mid-year meeting is to review progress and evaluate "mid-year checklists" and to revise the one year and five year strategic plan. The mid-year checklists have been developed. 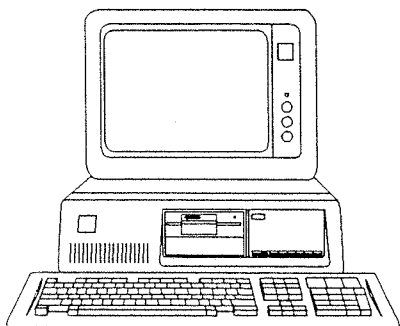
MEDICAL INFORMATICS LABORATORY ADDS SERVICES

The Medical Informatics Laboratory is now equipped with 17 PS/2 model 55 SX workstations, each with color monitor and printer. Databases on the CD-ROM network include Silver Platter's MEDLINE and CINAHL (Cumulative Index to Nursing & Allied Health Literature). Electronic Drug Reference is also available on the network as is AMA-FREIDA (American Medical Association Fellowship and Residency Electronic Interactive Database Access System).

This summer, the Laboratory initiated telephone access to the CD-ROM network. Selected Health Science Center patrons who already had passwords were asked to participate in a developmental phase where they could dial-in from office, lab, or home to use the system. This fall we opened up telephone access to the whole Health Science Center and to interested campus participants.

Lab orientation is now being incorporated into the Library's education program. This fall the Lab will offer standing courses which cover general lab orientation and instruction in database searching on the network. Later this fall, the Lab will offer other applications including word processing and spreadsheet analysis. For questions about the Lab, call John Sanderlin at 904-392-3854.

LIBRARY AWARDED NLM GRANT FOR AIDS INFORMATION NETWORK

The University of Miami School of Medicine is pleased to announce that the National Library of Medicine (NLM) of the National Institutes of Health has awarded a \$242,959 Information System Grant to the Louis Calder Memorial Library for the development of SEFAIN, the Southeast Florida AIDS Information Network. SEFAIN is a prototype of a community-based system for health professionals to directly access the information available locally and nationally to support Southeast Florida's high and ever increasing volume of AIDS patient care and research activities.

During Year 1 of the grant, a database of the hundreds of AIDS care and service providers in Dade, Broward and Monroe counties will be created by the Calder Library and fully integrated with its online public access catalog of books, journals and audiovisuals on AIDS and AIDS related diseases. During Year 2, health professionals in the tri-county area will be trained to directly access the Calder Library's online catalog and AIDS care provider database; the National Library of Medicine's AIDSLINE database of references to the AIDS literature published since 1980; and NLM's DOCLINE system for literature not available locally.

Immediate access to the many sources of information on AIDS is, per the National Library of Medicine, "one of the important aspects of the public health response to the AIDS crisis". With SEFAIN, a unique network of information available locally and nationally will support the efforts of health professionals in Southeast Florida to respond to and stop the AIDS epidemic.

LIBRARY COMPLETES ASBESTOS PROJECT

Our friends and patrons will be glad to know that we survived the asbestos removal project. At this very moment, the Library is resettling after nearly a year of disruption. Since all librarians love statistics, here are a few numbers which illustrate what our Library staff have doggedly accomplished during this travail. We moved over 61,000 monographs, over 173,500 journal volumes, and nearly 3,700 audiovisuals--twice! Every stick of furniture in the Library--over 2,000 pieces--was also moved twice. This does not take into account every computer that was moved and rewired and then moved back again and telephones that were relocated. Trust us, it was a big job. But we had just the person who could handle it, Esther Jones, our Head of Public Services. Esther is now available to hire out as a consultant to anyone facing a moving project!

We wish to thank our friends and colleagues throughout the state for their patience with us during this disruptive time. Document Delivery is now back in full swing as are our other Library services.

WELCOME TO CALDER LIBRARY MEDLINE

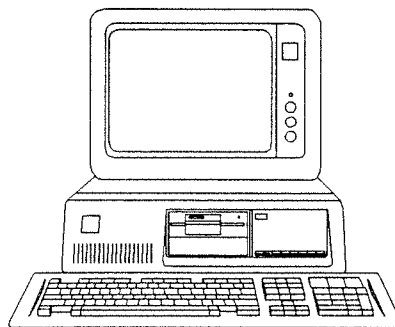
After many years of investigation and planning, the Louis Calder Memorial Library acquired a networked online MEDLINE system: the Plusnet 2 system from CD Plus, Inc. The complete MEDLINE database, 1966 to the present with abstracts and monthly updates, now resides on a high capacity hard drive in the Library's computer room. With a high performance file server, Novell and CD Plus network software and an Ethernet hub, users may now search the Calder Library MEDLINE system on the three microcomputers on the Library's first

floor dedicated to searching or from any IBM compatible with access to UMMEDNET, the School of Medicine's Ethernet LAN. Access via Apple computers and dial access via modem for off-campus patrons will be available in the near future.

The Library is very pleased to offer its patrons ready access to the MEDLINE database for a fraction of the costs previously associated with searches and with easy and elegant search menus not available from any other system or vendor. Whereas an average search on systems such as PaperChase and BRS Colleague takes about 9 minutes and costs 9 dollars or \$1.00 per minute, a search on Calder Library MEDLINE costs \$.25 per minute. Since the response time is faster, printing continues after you disconnect from the system, and there are no royalty, citation or per minute communication costs, the average search is shorter and costs \$2.00-\$3.00.

To maintain this nominal fee, avoid the high costs of billing, and afford patrons budgetary control, passwords are issued like the Library's copycard system. With an interdepartmental requisition, cash or check for \$100, passwords are programmed for 460 minutes (7.67 hours) of search time - 60 minutes of free time and 400 minutes at \$.25 per minute. When the 7.67 hours are used, additional search time may be purchased in the same way. For further information, please contact Tom Williams at 305-547-5782.
