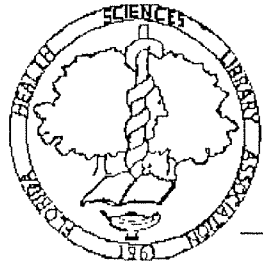
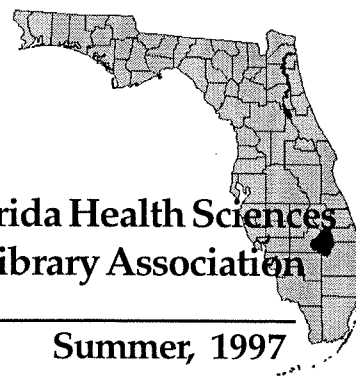

# President's Report: 1996-97

The Florida Health Sciences Library Association has had a productive year. Our membership is 108 with several members still expected to renew for the year.

We have also remained very solvent. Our balance as of Dec. 31, 1996, was \$6,766.26. Two members and one student received scholarships to assist them in attending the annual meeting. In addition, we sent a donation to the American Heart Association, as a memorial gift in remembrance of Alfred N. Brandon. He was a member of our association, but more importantly, he was a leader in medical librarianship.

My special thanks to Marta Cosculluela, program chair, along with her team members, for their work planning and preparing our annual meeting. The association received \$2,500 in donations to enable us to keep the meeting registration down. We are very appreciative of our sponsors.

The strategic planning committee, chaired by Clarissa Fisher, along with the executive committee, attended a mid-year meeting in St. Petersburg on Nov. 15. The day consisted of brainstorming for the future direction of our association. For subcommittees were formed:

1. Annual Meeting Roundtable Committee — to boost interest at the annual business meeting;
2. External Partnerships — to develop partnerships with other medically-related associations;
3. Listserv Committee — to enhance communication among members;
4. CE Committee — to inform members of CE regional programs and videos.

The foundation work has been completed this year for us to have a joint meeting with the Georgia Health Sciences Library Association in the spring of 1998.

This past year, production responsibilities for the Alert were transferred to the University of Florida at Gainesville. Thanks to Linda Buston for assuming editorship.

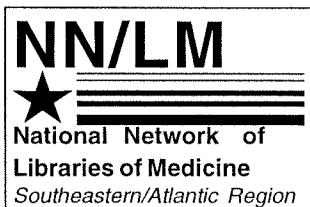

## Region News

### Free MEDLINE

On June 26 of this year, the National Library of Medicine held a press conference on Capitol Hill in Washington to announce free Web-based MEDLINE accessible through PubMed and Internet Grateful Med.



PubMed is an experimental search system that provides free access to MEDLINE in a single search. The search features include: Sets of related articles pre-computed for each article in MEDLINE; choice of search interfaces

from simple keywords to advanced Boolean expressions; searching by MeSH index terms (main topics and subheadings) and field restrictions; links to publishers' Web sites for full-text journals. Initially 24 journals are available, some by subscription only; clinical query form with search filters for diagnosis, therapy and prognosis; links to molecular biology database of DNA/protein sequences and 3-D structure data.

Internet Grateful Med provides free access to MEDLINE, as well as AIDSLINE and HealthSTAR. The features

include:

Use of the full range of Medical Subject Headings (MeSH) and the UMLS Metathesaurus; ability to limit searches by language, publication type, age groups, etc., using pull-down menus; Loansome Doc document delivery service. A version, released in July, allows free access to several additional databases (AIDSDRUGS, AIDSTRIALS, DIRLINE, HISTLINE, HSRPROJ, OLDMEDLINE and SDLINE) and no longer require a User ID.

Free MEDLINE is limited to Web-based searching via the Internet because of great savings to NLM in telecommunications and software costs. Thus, access to all NLM non-Web-based systems will continue to be billed (i.e. direct command language searching of ELHILL; TOXNET; PDQ; and the DOS, Macintosh and Windows versions of Grateful Med whether access is by direct dial, FTS2000, or the Internet.)

**UF's HSC Library**

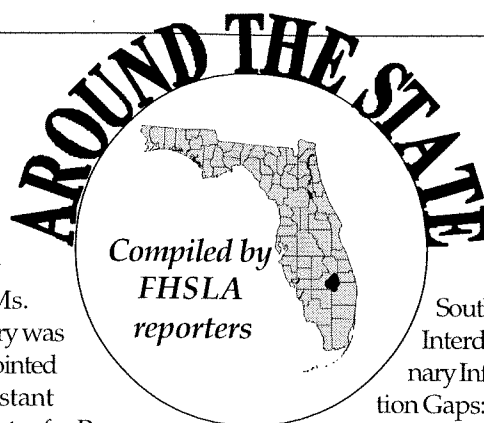

The article discussed the HSC Library's development of a MS Access database of journal and continuation subscriptions. The primary objective of the database was to develop numeric formula to rank individual titles for cancellation.

She also has been appointed to a three-year term as MLA's representative to the Association of Academic Health Science Libraries.

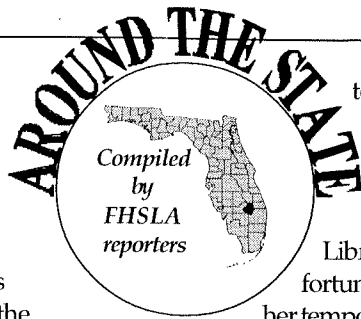

# FHSLA's annual business meeting minutes

Miami, Florida  
April 11, 1997

The annual business meeting of the Florida Health Sciences Library Association was called to order at 2:15 p.m. by the President, Pat Cole. She introduced the officers: Marta Cosculluela, Vice President and Program Chair; Prudence Tucker, Treasurer; and Pat Jennings, Secretary. She also introduced the committee chairs: Linda Butson, *Alert* Editor; Jenny Garcia-Barcelona, Archivist; Nancy Adams, CE coordinator; Pam Neumann, Membership Chair; Marta Cosculluela, Nominating Chair; Jan Booker, Union List Coordinator; Naomi Elia, Ad hoc Committee for Policy and procedure Manual; Pat Clark, Past President and Special Projects Coordinator.

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

Pat reviewed some of the accomplishments for the past year and gave special thanks to Marta Cosculluela and her team for their work in preparing our annual meeting, and keeping Pat informed of progress.

## SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Pat Jennings stated that a copy of the minutes of the 1996 meeting were included in each registration packet. A call for additions or corrections produced none. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Bettye Stilley and seconded by Pat Clark. The motion passed.

## TREASURER'S REPORT:

Prudence Tucker reported that as of 12/31/95, there was a balance of \$6,134.95. Income during 1996, including dues, interest and return from the 1996 annual meeting, totaled \$3,864.15. Expenses were \$3,232.84, leaving a balance of \$6,766.26 as of 12/31/96.

## ALERT EDITOR'S REPORT:

Linda Butson, Editor, reported that one hundred and seven (207) issues of the *Alert* were distributed in January along with membership renewal forms. The membership directory will be distributed with the July issue. She stated that reporters are needed to submit articles for publication.

## UNION LIST COORDINATOR'S REPORT:

Pat Cole, reporting for Jan Booker, stated that Jan sent out four (4) packets for DOCLINE participation along with letters of welcome and FHSLA membership forms.

## COMMITTEE REPORTS:

### STRATEGIC PLANNING:

Pat Clark, reporting for Clarissa Fisher, stated that the midyear meeting at All Children's Hospital produced four (4) areas targeted for planning for the organization. Four (4) subcommittees were formed: (1) CE — to inform members and encourage participation in CE programs and videos available; (2) Listserv — to enhance communication among members. Prudence Tucker will have this operational probably in July. (3) External Partnerships — to improve visibility of health-care libraries by participating in focus groups, primarily other state organizations, and serving as library advocates, and (4) Business Meeting Roundtables — to encourage membership participation in meeting the goals to support our changing roles as librarians.

### MEMBERSHIP:

Pam Neumann reported that as of April 9, there are one hundred and twelve (112) members including eleven (11) honorary and eighteen (18) new members with eighty two (82) not renewed. Reminder letters will be sent. Pam has asked to be relieved of this committee responsibility and Addajane Wallace has agreed to chair this committee next year.

### POLICY AND PROCEDURE MANUAL:

Naomi Elia stated the manual has been updated for the Treasurer, the *Alert* editor, and the Archivist/Historian. Additional revisions should be sent to Naomi. All paperwork from committees and officers should be sent to Jenny Garcia-Barcelona.

### NOMINATING:

The committee, composed of Suzetta Burrows, Pat Clark, Pat Cole, Pam Neumann and Marta Cosculluela, placed in nomination Barbara Francis as Vice President/Program Chair and Mary Kaye Raddatz as Secretary. Pat Clark moved the slate be accepted. The motion passed.

### OLD BUSINESS:

None was presented.

### NEW BUSINESS:

Pat Cole shared information from Tammy Lee of Auburn University and editor of the Southern Chapter newsletter, regarding a new discussion group for interested members, officers, past officers, and those interested in becoming officers. Anyone interested is invited to participate at the next Southern Chapter meeting. Pat Cole encouraged everyone to submit information about their libraries to the 1997 *Florida*

Bettye Stillely read the poem of invitation written by Carolyn Hall. The letter of acceptance from Marilyn Barry was read by Pat Cole and a poem of acceptance was read by Pam Neumann. Barbara Francis, incoming Vice President/Program Chair, urged everyone to attend the 1998 meeting. She stated a survey will be sent out regarding a proposed change from Wednesday through Friday to Thursday through Saturday, with CE courses being held on Saturday. **CHANGING OF THE GUARD:**

Pat Cole gave a brief, humorous speech (archives) about her reign as Pat "King" Cole, the program next year, and her introduction of our incoming president, Marta.

Marta expressed appreciation for the wonderful working relationship with pat and with the local support in hosting this meeting.

**ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION GROUPS:**

Roundtable discussion followed and summaries of the three (3) topics were presented.

**(1) State of the Medical Library Today** — Donna Doelling listed the areas we need to consider: Keep pace with technology — partnership with technical groups — keep up with education — consider the economics of new materials — coping with downsizing — JCAHO standards need to have libraries reinstated — fund-raising — mergers — marketing library services — become business savvy — acknowledge lack of time to do everything.

**(2) Medical Library of the Future** — Cheryl Dee stated we

need to address: Internet use — staying education — provide training in a one-on-one setting — mediated Internet searching — participate in group efforts with administration and other departments — provide archive service for our institutions — market the library — solicit funding from additional sources — provide group access to databases — provide consumer public-health information.

**(3) Fitting FHSLA into Your Future** — Pat Clark summarized ways we can work together: Consider what we want to keep or change — networking — management training — technology training "Train the Trainer" — joint ventures with the state library and other organizations — Listserv for job-seekers, jobs and consider those not having access — encourage junior college participation — add consortia representatives to the Strategic Planning Committee — expand invited papers — design evaluation tools for medical libraries — target non-traditional libraries (example: Miami Zoo) — tape some of our programs and sell the tapes — lobby legislators and congressmen — create a grant to design an exhibit for FHSLA — create canned presentations for loaning — share CE information.

Following these summaries, door prizes were distributed. The meeting was adjourned by Marta Cosculluela at 4 p.m.

[Gift, RG: Today's Management Methods, P. 156] The draft of FHSLA's first strategic plan was distributed in January 1985 with the Alert. Even though the plan has been revised, the basic mission to provide a forum for discussion and to sponsor activities to promote quality health care in Florida is still the reason for our existence.

Some accomplishments include: FHSLA/SEARMLS exhibit at the 1985 Florida Medical Association Annual Meeting; A Policy and Procedure Manual was implemented to aid incoming officers and committee chairman; excellent continuing education opportunities such as classes on quality assurance for the hospital librarian and opportunities for education services for the health sciences librarian.

The general duties of the Strategic Planning Committee (SPC) are:

1. Formulate the Association's Strategic Plan (SP) for approval by the membership

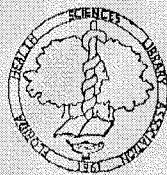
Congratulations Cheryl! We are proud to have one of our members be recognized by this impressive award. Keep up the good work!
