Federal Library/Information Center of the Year (Small Library Category):

The James A. Haley Veterans' Hospital Library in Tampa, Florida, has been selected as the 2002 Federal Library/Information Center of the Year in the small library category by the Federal Library and Information Center Committee (FLICC). The competition for this award was open to all federal libraries and information centers. The strength of the JAHVH Library Service is the variety and high level of outreach activities conducted by the library staff (Nancy Bernal, Chief Librarian; Janet Schneider, Patient Education Librarian; Charlotte Truitt, Clinical Medical Librarian; Laurie Barnett, Medical Librarian). Through the varied activities of its Patient Education Librarian, the JAHVH Library has been a nationally recognized leader in the field of patient health education for many years. Additionally, the Clinical Medical Librarian attends Medical Service Morning Report each morning (providing immediate feedback in the form of quality filtered information for the physicians), has created an electronic current awareness service for hospital staff, and is an active member of the Nursing Research Committee.

The award winners were honored March 19, 2003, at the 20th Annual FLICC Forum on Federal Information Policies at the Library of Congress in Washington, D.C., where they received their award from Dr. Billington, the Librarian of Congress and were guests of the forum. Their names will remain on permanent display in the FLICC offices at the Library of Congress.

In the January 2003 issue of Library Journal, Janet Schneider (Patient Education Librarian at the James A. Haley Veterans' Hospital) published a collection development article entitled "*Shaking Up Life: Parkinson's Disease*" [Vol. 128(1):61-64]. She lists books (covering general medical guides, treatment & therapy, coping issues, research, and personal narratives) and associations & web sites dealing with Parkinson's.

Activities:

The James A. Haley Veterans' Hospital's Patient Education Librarian, Janet Schneider, M.A., AHIP, was the primary presenter for the Hospital's winning Sterling Team in the Region 4 competition this year. In her role as Patient Education Committee member, Ms. Schneider is a Master Trainer of the Chronic Disease Self-Management Program (CDSMP) for the hospital. A CDSMP research study demonstrated that participants in the program had significant increases in quality of life, decreased hospital visits, and improved health behaviors. The Team also competed in the 11th Annual Sterling Conference in May, winning in the category of "Best for the Community." This hands-on introductory class discussing some of the principles of teaching the adult learner, the elements of effective easy-to-read materials elements such as design and layout, and their practical applications will be taught by Beth Wescott of the NN/LM in the Orange County Florida libraries on January 13th and 14th, 2004. It will also pay attention to the communication dynamics of providing understandable, easy-to-read health information to consumers and learn to adapt or add resources useful for low-literate adults. Participants will learn more about how adults manage with low literacy skills. The course will review the disconnect between health information providers and health information seekers, the success of "plain language" initiatives and the importance of text, type, graphics, vocabulary, space and layout. SMOG, REALM and FRY testing will be reviewed. The session covers published material, how to write your own material and ways to partner. Participants should bring pieces they use or some information that needs to be written in an easy-to-read manner.

It will be offered as a four-hour course with some time for writing and a class list for networking. The class is approved for 4 CE credits by the Medical Library Association.
