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

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

#### **UCF College of Medicine Earns Full Accreditation**

On February 7, 2013, Dr. Deborah German, Dean of the University of Central Florida's new College of Medicine, announced that the college received its full accreditation! The Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME), which completed its site visit at UCF COM in October 2012, granted the accreditation. UCF COM opened its doors in 2009 with its charter class of 41 medical students, all of who received full scholarships from generous community donors. These pioneering students are set to graduate this May and will be looking forward to Match Day on March 15, 2013. Since 2009, UCF COM has taken in 240 new students, and will reach full enrollment by 2017, starting with this year's incoming class of 120 students.

#### **UCF COM Charter Class Matches**

On March 15, 2013 the Charter Class of UCF College of Medicine joined medical students around the country as they found out where they would be spending the next few years of their professional lives as the college participated in its first ever Match Day. UCF COM students were accepted to a variety of prestigious residency programs, including those at Duke, Tufts, and Brown. Several Charter Class students will be staying in Florida, placing in residency programs in Orlando and Gainesville. The Health Sciences Library is proud to have played a role in helping our students on their way to becoming physicians.

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#### iPads or iPad minis for Medical Students?

In December 2012, the Harriet F. Ginsburg Health Sciences Library, the center of mobile technology deployment at UCF COM, began a study to determine if Apple's new 7.9 inch iPad mini is a better choice than a larger tablet for use in a clinical setting. UCF COM clinical faculty and students from each class were given the iPad mini, and the group has been meeting regularly to discuss their experiences with the smaller device. The library team hopes to publish its findings at the end of the study, and is also looking forward to using the study results to determine which device to provide to the new incoming class of medical students in August.

**Barbara Shearer** received the Fred L. Standley Award for Florida State University Academic Librarian of the Year on March 22, 2013. The Fred L. Standley Award honors an outstanding faculty member within the University Libraries at the Florida State University for significant contributions to campus, state, national and/or international research librarianship and library development. It is named for Fred L. Standley, FSU Daisy Parker Flory Professor of English and twice President of the Friends (1989-1995; 2006-2008), first recipient of the Friends' Distinguished Service Award, and for all of his long career in the English Department and the Faculty Senate a strong advocate for Florida State University Libraries.

Individuals nominated must demonstrate achievements in areas such as:

- 1. Planning and implementing a campus library program of exemplary quality.
- 2. Superior service to students and faculty on and off the campus.
- 3. Service to local, state, national, and international library organizations.
- 4. Significant research and publications.
